

Bonfires

It's been noted that there have been a few bonfires recently in the Valley. Stroud District Council (https://www.stroud.gov.uk/environment/environmental-health/pollution-and-nuisance/smoke-and-bonfires/smoke-control/) notes that

bonfires often cause a nuisance to neighbours from smoke, smell or dirt. SDC lists the following guidelines:

- · Only ever burn dry material
- Never burn household rubbish or anything with plastic, foam, paint, or rubber in it
- Never use old engine oil, methylated spirits, diesel or petrol to light or encourage a fire. Not only does this make smoke, it is also very dangerous
- Avoid lighting fires in unsuitable weather conditions such as damp, still days
- Avoid times when the wind will blow smoke over roads or into neighbour's gardens
- Avoid burning when people want to enjoy their gardens such as at weekends or Bank Holidays
- Air Pollution is described using ten index points, between LOW and VERY HIGH. Avoid burning when air pollution in the area is anything other than Low. You can check this at the DEFRA Air Information Resource at https://uk-air.defra.gov.uk/ which provides daily forecast levels of air pollution
- Never leave a fire unattended or leave it to smoulder
- Bear in mind the law of statutory nuisance mentioned above; regular smoky bonfires - or even a single one which is very polluting - could be regarded as a statutory nuisance and result in a legal notice being served on you by the Council

Garden Notes for May

I can't believe I'm well into my second year with these notes.. I'm sure time is speeding up!

Successional Sowing

I confess this is something I aspire to but have yet to nail. Good intentions are there in spades but often fall by the wayside as the rest of the garden jobs compete for attention. Wherever you do your sowing, have a calendar. Charles Dowding (the no-dig guru) has a brilliant one with optimal sowing dates for particular crops but sometimes this can be intimidating. An alternative could be printing out a blank calendar monthly and fill in when and what you sow in one colour and have a different colour for the next sowing date in two weeks time and so on. Add a reminder on your phone if thats how you like to work.

Paeonias - Three types to consider for a long flowering season

These are long lived garden plants for well drained soil in sun. Don't bury the crown or this will result in few or no blooms. Most commonly planted are the **Herbaceous paeonia** - these die back every winter and return with fresh new growth every year. The flowers are stunning but have a relatively short flowering time in May/June. Favourites of mine are Sarah Bernhardt (pink) and Duchesse de Nemours (white). They usually require support for the heavy flower heads. More of an investment are **Tree Paeonia** - these grow to be small shrubs, retaining their woody structure

through winter. Totally hardy and not requiring pruning they respond with glorious flowers from April to late May. I have 'Godaishu' (white) and 'Shimadaijin (red). Every year I wait with bated breath for their flowers. Newer to the scene and not yet so readily available are Intersectional Paeonias These are a cross between the herbaceous and tree paeonias resulting in a woody mounding shrub that loses its leaves in winter and will only need pruning back to a swelling bud in Spring. They are long flowering (up to three weeks) and occasionally can produce some flowers in the late summer. They seem to be best of both worlds, being adaptable and resilient, with new colours coming to the market every year. I have yet to try them myself - I'd have to dig something else up!

Since all these varieties will last in your garden a long time, its worth buying from specialist producers with tried and tested varieties.

As always, watch for pesky munchers - aphids (wash off with water) and slugs (try garlic spray, beer traps or yeast traps which I'm trialling this year as cheaper than beer and it doesn't matter if it rains. https://forum.charlesdowding.co.uk/community/topic/slug-snail-trap-using-bakers-yeast/
